Halloween Trail Clinic – 19 October 2013

HELMETS are required for all riding participants.

All obstacles will be decorated with a Halloween theme – cornstalks, pumpkins, ghosts, spider webs, bats, owls, etc.

All primary obstacles have three skill levels. Primary Obstacles include:

- Backing (straight, L, and loop) 7 barrels and 8 railroad ties or landscape timbers, 4 ea trees
- Bridges (plywood, flat step-up, arched, teetering) very small log under bridge for teeter bridge and 4' x 6' bridge
- Gates (mounted metal gate with panels, rope gate, simulated cattle gate with vinyl 1" x 1" square barrier fence) need 3 stanchions, sandbags, 10' green braided nylon rope, metal gate w/panels
- Water Obstacle (tarp flat on ground, tarp over square of landscape timbers, pond liner over 9" high landscape timber square frame with water) need two tarps, single landscape timber square, pond liner, 2 timber high square, sandbags, shovel, and rake
- Walk-Overs (logs, ground poles, serpentine ground poles); Trot-Over (elevated ground poles, railroad ties) need logs with foliage, 12 ground poles, 6 landscape timbers, 6 railroad ties
- Cowboy Curtain (10' curtain and tree branches, dense curtain; simple curtain, and side tickler) – need 10' PVC stand, curtains, foliage; borrow Back Country Horseman cowboy curtain, and side tickler
- Sidepassing (straw bales, ground pole, ground handling movement) need two straw bales, 1 ea ground pole
- Ground Handling (dismount/mount, halter, bridle/unbridle horse, ground tie, tack check; handling and placing full saddlebags, water bottle, horn bag, slicker/duster, safety vest, etc. on horse)

Other Obstacles that may be available:

- Deer Hide/bones
- 360 Box
- Feed Bags on Ground
- Moving tools from one point to another point
- ATV
- Rabbit running across trail
- Mailbox w/mail
- Set-up camp (tent, fake fire, Halloween music, ghost)
- Cornfield with Scarecrow

Urban Trail includes:

- Stroller with crying baby doll and balloon
- Pennants and streamers
- Umbrellas

- Flags
- Trash can with bagged cans noise maker
- Shopping cart with bags and boxes
- Large stuffed animal
- Sounds of the City CD playing (marching band, drum and bugle, sirens, etc.)
- Cemetery with bats and ghosts
