GETTING THERE – From Horseshoe Bend, take Highway 52 nine miles west to the junction with the Sweet/Ola Highway. Turn north and travel 16 miles to Ola on Forest Road 618 and 626 (Gravel). Follow the signs for 18 miles to Sagehen Reservoir. Turn left (west) on Forest Road 626 and follow the signs.
